ROTARY FELLOWSHIP IDEAS

Rotarians are often so busy working for the community that they forget the importance of club fellowship. Here are a few fellowship ideas to consider.

Wine Tasting/Buffer: This is a great event for autumn. Club members, their families and friends are invited for an evening of wine, food, and conversation. In addition to good fellowship, the function can also serve in a small way to raise extra funds (to be earmarked for Rotary Foundation or a particular Club Project, for instance).

Regular Meetings as Family Events: Each year on special occasions (such as Christmas, Easter or the start of Spring) regular Club luncheon meetings can be held as special events to include members' families - with a special menu, a brief program and a more festive atmosphere. These events can also include special guests such as Honorary Rotarians.

Theater Night: A nice way to promote Club fellowship is to attend a theatre production or a screening of a new important movie. This could be followed by a light meal at a member's home or a restaurant - or even just everyone going for an ice cream.

Fireside Chats: These are traditional Rotary events in the form of informal meetings of small groups of members and families, held in members' homes. Prospective members can also be invited. Newer members in particular have found these informal sessions a great way to get to know other Rotarians and get to know more about the workings of Rotary.

Workplace Visits: These are a great way to combine the Fellowship and Vocational Service aspects of Rotary. Two or three members host the other members for visits to their places of work. Such events can go far to expand our knowledge of one another's professions and provide another occasion for informal camaraderie.

Club Raids: A great way to interact with other Rotary Clubs in your city, is to "raid" one of their club meetings. Remember to warn their secretary so that provision can be made for additional meals, etc.

Old Friends Network: Many club directories have an "Old Friends" section with contact information on members who have left the club because of transfer or retirement, so members can maintain contact. Often these former members return to visit their former clubs for a meeting. This could even lead to such a former member rejoining the club.

Mentorship: New members can be assigned a formal mentor, and encouraged to "get involved" rapidly. Each new member is also given an opportunity at a club meeting to talk about their life and profession.

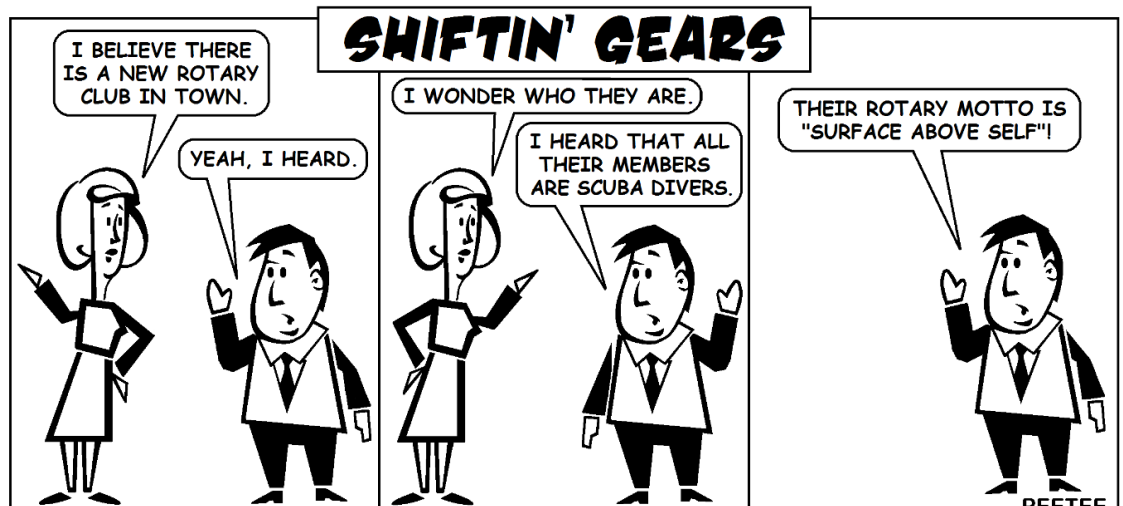
