No one likes to be uncomfortable, so it is natural that we try and stay within our comfort zones, at work and everywhere else. Yet it is only outside our comfort zones that the big gains are to be found – not only for individuals but also for teams and organizations – because these are the places of learning and growth. As this infographic illustrates, when we move beyond the Fear Zone (with all its excuses and self-doubts), we enter the Learning Zone, where we acquire new skills and increase our ability to deal with challenges and problems. Then, beyond the Learning Zone, is the Growth Zone, where we find purpose, set new goals, meet our objectives, and live our dreams. So the question is: If the crucial first step is getting past the fear zone, how can we as leaders empower first ourselves, and then the people we work with, to dip a toe into the chilly water and then swim beyond discomfort into learning and growth? ## 6 - THE 4-WAY TEST

One of the most widely printed and quoted statements of business ethics in the world is the Rotary "4-Way Test." It was created by Rotarian Herbert J. Taylor in 1932 when he was asked to take charge of the Chicago based Club Aluminum Company, which was facing bankruptcy. Taylor looked for a way to save the struggling company mired in depression-caused financial difficulties. He drew up a 24-word code of ethics for all employees to follow in their business and professional lives. The 4-Way Test became the guide for sales, production, advertising and all relations with dealers and customers, and the survival of the company was credited to this simple philosophy.

Herb Taylor became president of Rotary International during 1954-55. The 4-Way Test was adopted by Rotary in 1943 and has been translated into more than 100 languages and published in thousands of ways. The message should be known and followed by all Rotarians.

**"Of the things we think, say or do:**

**1. Is it the TRUTH?**

**2. Is it FAIR to all concerned?**

**3. Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?**

**4. Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?"**

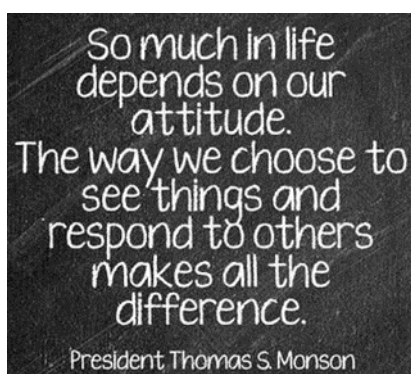
